




For the native people of the Andes, the descendants of the Inka civilization, all aspects of the world in which we live are endowed with life and consciousness. Native people of the Andes inhabit a universe full of life, visible and invisible, from the stars in the night sky, to the sun and moon, to the spirits of sacred places, and the spirits of our ancestors. Grounded in this vision of the cosmos. Andean people organize their lives according to the principle of "Ayllu", a concept of community made up not only of human beings, but also of all other beings with whom we share our existence, from rocks and rivers to animals and plants. In the Ayllu, the interconnectedness of all beings forms a living, vibrant unity, no single element of which is greater or lesser than any other, all of them necessary for the symbiotic functioning of this intricate web of life.



Based in this view of reality, the Andeans deeply understand the following principals of life:

Ayni (reciprocity, balance)

Munay (love, desire, transformation, beauty)

Yachay (knowledge, wisdom, co-creation)

Llankay (ritual and ceremony)

Through ceremony and ritual, as well as experiential teachings, all passed down for centuries from the Inca spiritual masters, you will ecplore and practice all these concepts, while guided by native masters from the highest levels of this tradition.



Day 1, 10/11
Arrival in Cusco, adaptation and welcoming ceremony in the afternoon.

Day 2, 10/12
Visit to the temples of Saqsaywaman,
Kusillochayoq and Tambomachay.
Offering for the Apus (Sacred Mountain
Spirits).

Day 3, 10/13
Trip to the Sacred Valley Visit to the temple in Pisaq.
Inti Karpay (sun initiation).

Day 4, 10/14 Visit to the temple of the stars , temple of Mother Earth. Karpay.

Day 5 10/15
Visit to the temple of Moray and the temple of Killarumiyoq (the moon stone). Return to Cusco.

Day 6 10/16
Visit to natural spring of Pumamarka, cleansing and visit to the temple of Tipon working with your life purpose.





Day 7, 10/17

Trip to the sacred mountain of Ausangate. Introductory ritual, working with the energies of the Apu and the Land.

Day 8, 10/18

Trip by horse to the Ausangate Lagoons, Initiation ritual with the Ñustas, the female energies in nature, and with the Apu.

Day 9 10/19

Closing ritual in Ausangate and return to Cusco.

Day 10, 10/20

Free day in Cusco with optional tour to the local Market and through the city.

Day 11 10/21

Trip to the Ollantaytambo temple in the morning. Train to Machu Picchu and visit to the beautiful Mandor Falls.

Day 12 10/22 Visit to the Machu Picchu Citadel. Return to Cusco.

masters.






THE KARPAY

A Karpay is an ancestral Andean initiation ritual. It is a practice of empowerment that through a transmission of energy from teacher to student, connects the latter with the living energies of Nature.

The master with his experience channels the power of Mother Earth, the Guiding Spirits of the mountains, and of the water, the sun and the moon, the lineages of his previous masters, etc.

Thus, we receive Karpays to integrate and grow these connections with the living world around us, and to enhance our experience as human and energetic beings.







PRICE

2350 usd which includes:

- -12 nights of lodging (7 nights 3 stars hotel in Cusco city shared room; 2 nights lodge sacred valley shared room, 2 nights in community's house in Ausangate mountain, shared room). All with breakfast included.
- 5 lunches at local restaurants in cusco and Sacred Valley; 2 days full board at Ausangate; snacks for day 11 on the way to Machu Picchu.
- -Transportation between all the sites mentioned in the itinerary. Round trip to Ausangate by van. Round trip by train to Machu Picchu Pueblo. Bus between Machu Picchu and Pueblo.
- -5 days working with local "Paqos" shamans in Cusco and Sacred Valley. 3 days work with Altomisayoq Don Martin Quispe's family in Ausangate. Plus all materials for the rituals.
- -Tickets to access all temples in the program, including Machu Picchu.
- -Guide by Amalia Escobar Galpert and Francisco Victoria.

Does not include:

- -Plane tickets.
- -Taxis or personal transportation.
- -Day 1 breakfast, lunch or dinner, nor any dinner through the program except for 2 dinners included in Ausangate.
- -Day 10 lunch.
- -Day 12 lunch.
- -MEDICAL INSURANCE. It is mandatory to have it for the duration of the trip, a copy will be required before arrival.
- -Personal sessions with the paqos outside of the program.
- -Horse in Ausangate. (optional one day, with extra 30 usd)

RESERVATION

A deposit of 600 usd is required prior to the trip.

Please check with usregarding available forms of payment at the time of your booking. Such as:

- 2. Bank account international transfer.
- 3. Credit card payment.



PLEASE TAKE INTO ACCOUNT:

- -Cusco city is at an altitude of 3300 meters above sea level (almost 11.000 feet). This means your body needs a time to adapt. We always recommend that passengers arrive at least a day prior to the start of the program. Otherwise arrive early in the morning of the first day.
- -Your first day in Cusco, take it easy! Slow walks and soft meals, and a light dinner not past 6 pm. Hotels generally offer a coca leaf tea that will help you.
- -Same goes for Ausangate, at 4300 mts above sea level (14.000 feet). First night in the mountain you may experience difficulty breathing or a bit of insomnia. Don't worry too much, it's part of the experience.
- -The Ausangate lodge is in a community's family humble yet cozy house, you will be stying in bedrooms shared by up to 6 fellow travelers.
- -In cusco and ausangate we will have hikes from 10 mins up to 2:30 hours. Let us know if you have any concerns.
- -Please report any medical condition you have.
